

# *Descendants of McKenzie*

## *Generation No. 1*

### 1. MCKENZIE<sup>1</sup>

Notes for MCKENZIE:

Although the first name of Stephen McKenzie's father, my great-great-great grandfather, is unknown to me, he does provide an ideal place in the program to discuss my sources and to speculate about our origins further back than the paper trail can take us. This also gives me the opportunity to acknowledge the contributions of my editor and sister, Peg McKenzie, who made a considerable number of rewrite suggestions.

The primary source of this tree is my father's cousin, Mary Moran (daughter of Anthony and Annie McKenzie), whose remarkable memory is supported by several decades of saved paperwork including death notices, funeral cards, wedding invitations, birth and other announcements, letters of general interest and many old photos. I have named my Family Tree Maker for Windows computer file "Mary Moran Tree (with the most recent version's month\_year).ftw" in grateful appreciation of her efforts.

Over the years Mary received letters from several of the relatives who were likewise interested in preserving this information. Most remarkable among these letters was a tree sent to Mary by cousin Margaret Horgan in 1971. Margaret was a daughter of Michael McKenzie, eldest son of John "Red Jack" McKenzie. In 1971 she lived with her husband Bill Horgan in Ft Lauderdale, Florida, where she passed away in June of 1986. Margaret sent the tree to Mary Moran with a cover letter that unfortunately failed to mention who authored the document. Mary had the impression that Margaret herself was the author but given that the page of the tree that contains the family of John McKenzie (a brother of Michael) of West Hartlepool, England is clearly marked "our branch" I could see that one of John's five daughters must have produced the tree. John's youngest daughter, Sheila Killelea, lived in Florida with her husband, Andrew, and was likely in touch with her cousin Margaret Horgan. Sheila died in Sarasota, Florida in February of 1989. Three of her sisters lived in England and one in Rhodesia. I noted the tree was hand printed on 8x10 inch Basildon bond, an English brand and size of paper. I hope to find descendants of "our branch" in England who might recognize the source of the handwriting. I refer to this tree in the following notes and sources as "first" or "oldest".

The other trees that Mary Moran received were less comprehensive covering mainly the immediate families who produced them: the Buecheles, the Goldricks and the Mangans. My cousin, Bob Dix, was the first researcher to enter the McKenzie family tree information into a computer. Since I began with his material Bob is frequently cited as the source; either from the 1989 printout of his tree or from the FTW (Family Tree Maker for Windows) computer file that he gave me in 1995. I have tried to replace these memory based sources with documentation of an official nature wherever possible. That would include birth, marriage and death certificates, death notices, census information, city directories, immigration and naturalization documents, and tax and property records.

Most of the earliest official documentation from Ireland comes from a genealogical business, the North Mayo Family Heritage Centre (NMFHC), located in Enniscoe some few miles south of Crossmolina. They are a part of the Irish Family History Foundation and have access to Irish civic and parochial records up to 1900. The 1901 and 1911 censuses of Ireland are available to the public at the Irish National Archives in Dublin. These two documents have been made available to researchers despite a legal requirement of confidentiality for 100 years because all the previous census materials were destroyed in the early 1920's, the "time of the troubles," as the Republic of Ireland was being created. The 1901 census is widely available on microfilm and work continues on the filming of the 1911 census. The National Archives also contain wills and other legal documents.

Also available to researchers are two older surveys of Ireland ordered by the tax revenue authorities to determine tax rates. Both surveys include the names of all leaseholders at the time the surveys were taken. These are the Tithe Applotments taken in the 1830's (Knockroe was surveyed in 1834) and Griffith's General Valuation of Rateable Property in Ireland in 1856 (Richard Griffith actually surveyed Ireland from 1848 to 1865). The tithes were payable in money (not "in kind" as had been previously allowed) to the established Protestant Church of Ireland and were bitterly resented by the Irish Roman Catholics who supported both the Protestant and Catholic parishes they lived in. The tithes were abolished in 1838 and replaced by the Poor Law Act, a public assistance

program designed to support a workhouse for the destitute poor in each Poor Law Union administrative district. Griffith's Valuation was undertaken to update the tax base for the Poor Law Act. The McKenzie name is found in seventeen places in Mayo in that 1856 document. We are warned by the North Mayo FHC that in some cases a name could be mentioned twice if the landholder had more than one leaseholding. That is if he leased properties in more than one location, then his name showed up more than once.

My great grandfather, John "Red Jack" McKenzie, is the earliest known ancestor to appear in the public record found so far. From the report of the North Mayo FHC, "The Tithe Applotments of 1834 for the parish of Kilgarvin (now known as Bonniconlon) do not list any McKenzies residing in the townland of Rathreedaun or its subdivision, Knockroe....John McKenzie is listed on Griffith's Valuation of 1856 as residing in the townland of Rathreedaun, in the parish of Kilgarvin.... John McKenzie leased a house and offices (farm buildings) on 25 acres, 2 roods and 30 perches of land, which he held in conjunction with Barbara McKenzie....It is probable that Barbara McKenzie was a widow and maybe John McKenzie's mother. No [other] records could be found relating to Barbara McKenzie."

Most Irish parochial registers maintained by the local clergymen are available. The starting dates vary from place to place. The Bonniconlon parish baptismal register begins on March 1, 1870. The marriage register covers 1844 to 1881 and then from 1897 onward. The British civil authorities required registration of all births, marriages and deaths beginning on January 1, 1864. However this legal requirement was ignored by some 15 to 20 percent of the Mayo Irish. In addition, because the requirement carried a fine if late, many of the Irish find themselves being baptised before being officially born. The baptismal record is deemed to be more accurate, generally occurring within a week of birth.

The North Mayo report begins by telling us the McKenzie name comes from Scotland and our McKenzie ancestors most likely came from there during one of the clearances of Catholics from the Highlands. Oliver Cromwell (Lord Protector 1653-58) declared that Catholics could go to hell or to Connaught, for if they stayed in Scotland they would be killed. However we have some evidence that the departure of our ancestors was more than a century after Cromwell. More research can be done on this point from the Scottish end.

Richard Tobin showed me a map of the route our McKenzie ancestors would have taken from Scotland, southwest along the Donegal coast to the Ox Mountains on the Sligo side in the barony of Leyney. He did not mention how long ago this might have happened, only that he had been told we came to Bonniconlon from Leyney and thus our McKenzies must have settled there first. Bonniconlon is in the barony of Gallen. The 1834 County Sligo Tithe Applotments for Leyney have not been checked yet.

According to the North Mayo Family History Center, Knockroe is a localized name for a part of Rathreedaun townland. A townland is a political subdivision of Ireland roughly analogous to an American township. While a township is almost always a six by six mile square containing 36 square miles or 2,304 acres, Irish townlands are highly irregular in shape and size. Rathreedaun contains just over 659 acres and is located in the northwest corner of Kilgarvan/ Bonniconlon. This parish and the parish of Attymas, south and slightly west, make up most of the barony of Gallen. All boundaries have been subject to change over the centuries in Ireland.

From the pamphlet "Bonniconlon 1840 - 1990, An Historic, Social and Demographic Study," Bonniconlon, also called Bunnyconellan, Rumconlon, and in Gaelic, Muine Conallain, means "Little Connall's Shrubbery". The pamphlet details the history of Bonniconlon parish, owned for centuries by the O'Dowda family who were Catholics. Tradition has it that the parish was founded by St Fechin in 664 and was named after its church, "Cill na nGarbhan, church of the Garvans, or of the rough mannered people" located just a mile and a quarter south of the present day village of Bonniconlon. The pamphlet credits James O'Dowda with having "built a fine road about 1796 which shortened the distance from Ballina to Benada (in County Sligo) by eight miles." The new road passed through Bonniconlon which assumed a new importance in the local economy and probably then became the new name of the parish. If the new road saved eight miles, then the older road must have gone southeast from Ballina following the course of the River Moy to Benada, Sligo to avoid the Ox Mountains altogether. All that remains at the Kilgarvan site today is an ancient cemetery which includes the graves of Michael and Ellen (Browne) McKenzie, Patrick and Catherine Loftus and the IRA plot that contains a memorial to Commandant William Loftus (who is actually buried in Mt Olivet in Chicago).

The O'Dowda family owned the Bonniconlon area from at least 1302 until 1856. In 1798 the French encouraged a Catholic revolt in Ireland. James O'Dowda led the rebellion in the west. General Humbert and 3,000 troops were sent from France to help but after initial successes at Ballina and Castlebar in Mayo and at Collooney in Sligo the

rebellion was suppressed. The French troops were sent home and the Irish were slaughtered. James O'Dowda died in battle (or was executed) and in 1856, his son Thaddeus O'Dowda sold the estate to Charles Downing.

It may have been just after the 1798 rebellion that the McKenzies left Scotland and made their way to Bonniclonn arriving between 1800 and 1807. The first McKenzie to appear in the oldest tree is Stephen McKenzie the grandfather of my grandfather, James (spouse Beatrice, nee Bridget Loftus) McKenzie. That tree contains six blank spaces for younger siblings of Stephen McKenzie but it contains nothing further of that generation and the line continues on as though the author was not sure how many more children there might have been. This tree is also a source for the birth order of Stephen's children and grandchildren. The paper documentation gathered so far has found it to be accurate. Therefore, I speculate that the tree's author believes that Stephen was the eldest of at least seven children.

Then we come to the story given to us by the Reverend Edmund Hayburn. My father, William E. McKenzie, Sr received a first letter from Rev Hayburn in November of 1986. The Reverend had visited with Richard Tobin in Castlebar a week before the letter was written and Richard had given him my father's address in Chicago as a potential source of family tree information. In brief, the Reverend claimed to be descended from a "Barbara McKenzie who was born in Scotland about 1791 [1794 in another letter]. She and her four brothers came down from Scotland as shepherds in the employ of a landlord named Lyttle and passed through Colooney, Co Sligo into Mayo - Bonniclonn. Barbara soon afterward married John Roland McManaman of Grouse Hill, Co Mayo who dealt in cattle, when she was about 16 years old [i.e. about 1807]. They had three children....John McManaman died when Barbara was 21 years old [i.e. about 1812]....[In 1831 she and the children and several other relatives emigrated to Montreal, Canada and from there went to Detroit, Michigan where] she remarried to a wealthy man, Daniel Corby of Grosse Pointe, Michigan and later had five more children...she died in Detroit about 1844. My Aunt Marguerite told me that her mother's grandmother Barbara McKenzie was red haired and beautiful and very intelligent."

"During my first visit to Ireland I met your sister (niece?) [actually, first cousin] Margaret Mangan Tobin, the mother of Dr. Dick Tobin. She told me that her mother was also named Barbara McKenzie who was from Bonniclonn and was red haired. Probably she was named after my great great grandmother the first Barbara McKenzie to come to Ireland. This year I spent two days with Lizzie McKenzie, widow of James McKenzie of Carracrum, Bonniclonn [Carracrum is a townland about two miles south and west of Bonniclonn]. Years before I had met her husband, James, who told me that he knew that he was related to Margaret Mangan Tobin, but did not know exactly how. He might have descended from another of Barbara's brothers if not the same one as your family."

Richard Tobin and Bill McKenzie, Sr came to view the family tree the Reverend presented with some skepticism because of the many very important people appearing in it. Reverend Hayburn also claimed that his gggg grandfather was a Capt William Mangan making him doubly related to Richard Tobin who found this implausible. Most of this tree cannot be substantiated. We will simply have to wait and see if the story can be corroborated from other McKenzie sources who have never heard of Reverend Hayburn.

2. i. STEPHEN<sup>2</sup> MCKENZIE, b. Bet. 1770 - 1790; d. Bef. 1856.

#### *Generation No. 2*

2. STEPHEN<sup>2</sup> MCKENZIE (*MCKENZIE*<sup>1</sup>) (Source: *Bob Dix FTW program.*) was born Bet. 1770 - 1790 (Source: sheer guess, see notes.), and died Bef. 1856 (Source: see Notes under More button.). He married MARY (BARBARA?) MULLEN (Source: *Bob Dix FTW program.*).

Notes for STEPHEN MCKENZIE:

The first tree has the word "killed" next to Stephen's name though it is written by someone other than the first author. I hope to find him between 1818 (son John's reported birth year) and 1856 (Stephen is not listed in Griffith's Valuation at Knockroe) in police records or perhaps a newspaper account. We must keep in mind Stephen may not be the McKenzie who left Leyney in Sligo. Remember there are no McKenzies at Knockroe in the 1834 Tithe Applotments and only his son John is listed in the 1856 Griffith's Valuation.

I estimated the year of his birth, based on youngest son John being born about 1818 which then requires oldest

child Hannah to be born before 1815 if her subsequent siblings were born each year. The more likely every other year pattern would mean Hannah was born about 1810. If Stephen was about 30 yrs old when married then he was born about 1780. If he married at about the age of 20, then he was born about 1790. (Remember the hint we have that the Barbara McKenzie who may or may not be his sister was born about 1791 or 1794. Then Stephen, who may have been the eldest, was born before 1790.) Therefore a rough guess for his birth year would be circa 1780 plus or minus ten years. In any event this is a highly speculative paragraph.

Notes for MARY (BARBARA?) MULLEN:

The original 1989 Bob Dix database shows her name as "Mary McMahan??" . His information was taken from a spirit duplicated copy of our family tree. Its unique purple color of ink indicates it was almost certainly produced in a Chicago public school. Not surprising as we had a large number of relatives working in the public and parochial systems in the 1970's. The copy I was given by John McKenzie (grandson of Stephen and Maria) is so illegible at Mary's name that McMahan is a possibility. I am fairly certain that this tree was based on Mary Moran's copy of the oldest tree from Margaret Horgan which clearly cites the name "Mullen". ("Mullin?" is entered in the 1995 Dix.ftw database.)

That oldest tree had "Barbara" crossed out and replaced in the original handwriting with "Mary?" Mullen. But the North Mayo FHC suggests that the Barbara McKenzie who occupied a holding next to John McKenzie in the 1856 Griffith's Valuation is probably a widow and may be John's mother. So I have added "Barbara?" to her name field. She is not mentioned in the 1861 update at the Dublin Valuation Office which could mean she has moved in with someone else or that she has died.

Mary Moran speaks of a Delia Mullin who often visited her Uncle Stephen and Uncle Patrick McKenzie in Chicago. Delia occasionally visited with Uncle Anthony (Mary's father) and Uncle James (my grandfather). And Delia had a brother named John living on West Jackson Blvd that Uncle James visited. Bob Dix reports that all his mother could remember was that all the kids would groan when it was announced that Delia was coming to visit. She doesn't remember any relationship though Delia was of an age with Grandma Bea. Delia Mullin and Patrick Igoe are listed as sponsors for Bernice McKenzie's baptism in November 1914 at Nativity parish.

7/30/01 Mary Moran adds that Delia was in domestic service and the brother was named John who lived in the Logan Square area of Chicago in the 1930's. I found this John Mullen in both census and city directories. He is definitely linked to us in the following paragraph, so I obtained his death certificate and the names of his children from his death notice. I mean to try to contact his descendants through the Wilmette funeral home that handled the services for his daughter, Laurene Woodward, in 1999.

I found Delia's entry in the NARA Naturalization Index. She lived at 1441 N. State and at 415 Astor St in Chicago. Her birthdate was November 25, 1870. (Born in Ireland according to her listing in the 1920 US Census. She was 49 yrs old and lived as a servant to Charles Bradley at 5323 Hyde Park Blvd.) She entered the US October 10, 1896 but no port of entry was listed in the space provided. The date of her naturalization was December 18, 1922 and the affidavit witnesses were Stephen McKinzie (sic) of 139 W. 74th St and John Mullin of 2442 N. Albany Ave. There's our link, though no relationships were cited in the paperwork. Also worth mentioning here, a John Mullen and Margaret McKenzie were witnesses to the marriage of Patrick McKenzie and Anna Finland at St James Church at 29th and Wabash in Chicago October 17, 1900.

In the 1930 US census, Delia Mullin is living with John J. Mullen and his three children, John F, James V, and Laurene at 2442 N. Albany. John J. is listed as a widower and Delia is listed as "cousin, 58 [b. 1871, if November is right], housekeeper for a private family." The last names are clearly spelled differently.

2442 N. Albany is the place of John's death July 6, 1945. According to his death certificate, he was born in County Mayo and his parents were Martin Mullen and Mary Hart of Ireland. The informant was his son, John F. Mullen of 4710 W. Jackson Blvd. No Cook County death certificate has been found for Delia, yet.

The only Delia Mullin I could find in Chicago in 1900 was born October 1876 in Norway and worked as a servant to Canute R. Matson at 609 Cleveland in Chicago. Perhaps our Delia was in Philadelphia at 198 Godfrey St (another Mary Moran memory, look for a nun there as well). Bob Dix found a Delia Mullin and Kate Loftus in Philadelphia in the 1900 census. They are servants to a William Walton at 4820 Regent St. This Delia Mullin lists her birth year as 1878 and claims to be 21 years old, not 29.

I found a record of death in the online IL State index for a Delia Mullen, white female, died 12/14/1944 in

Chicago, cert #0034589. I found her death notice in CDN. However, this is not our Delia. This is a married woman, wife of Patrick J.

Children of STEPHEN MCKENZIE and MARY MULLEN are:

Notes for HANNAH MCKENZIE:

They had no children per Mary Moran.

Per Stephen Beck research, Hanna(h) is a diminutive for Honor or Honora.

Mayo North "found no records relating to this couple". I found the reference to a marriage between Hannah McKenzie and a James McAndrew after I sent in the application to Mayo North. I'll send a follow-up question via email on the possibility that Ned McAndrew from our original tree and James McAndrew in the marriage registry are one and the same.

Notes for NED (JAMES?) MCANDREW:

Mary Moran's memory and trees have him as a Ned. But the marriage record names him James. While it is not difficult to imagine a James Edward, nicknamed Ned, this marriage record remains questionable.

More About NED MCANDREW and HANNAH MCKENZIE:

Notes for BRIDGET MCKENZIE:

They had no children per Mary Moran.

North Mayo FHC "found no records relating to this couple." I found the marriage in pages of the Kilgarvan marriage registry sent to me by Stephen Beck. There is no proof that this refers to our relatives, only that the names match and the date is appropriate.

North Mayo did find reference to a marriage between a Bridget McKenzie and Owen Ruane. Their daughter, Mary Langan, applied for a pension in 1916 and the pension board noted that the family was found in the 1851 census which was still in existence in 1916. North Mayo goes on to say, "there is no conclusive proof to establish whether this family are related to Stephen McKenzie, however, they have been included in the genealogy, as they are the only Ruane and McKenzie records found." I will ask the North Mayo FHC at some future date about the reference I found.

### Generation No. 3

3. MICHAEL<sup>3</sup> MCKENZIE (*STEPHEN*<sup>2</sup>, *MCKENZIE*<sup>1</sup>) (Source: *Bob Dix FTW program.*) was born Bef. 1817, and died Bef. 1901 in Ireland (Source: Valuation Office Records, Dublin.). He married ANNE (NANCY) DURKIN February 01, 1852 in Kilgarvan Parish, Mayo, Ireland (Source: Marriage Registry of Kilgarvan Parish, Mayo, Ireland.). She was born Unknown in Ireland, and died Unknown (Source: Initial conversation with Jack Marsden.).

Notes for MICHAEL MCKENZIE:

The oldest tree, the one sent by Margaret Horgan, only shows that John McKenzie had two older sisters and two older brothers with no further details about them. However, notes added to that tree in a different hand (Mary Moran's?) included what I took to be the names of Michael's children. There were "John, Brother Patrick (Pres in Manhattan College NY), Martin, Catherine Neary (husband Bill), (son in NY, John)." Brother Patrick's death notice in the NY Times led me to Michael's descendants in New York. First to great grandson Jack Marsden who pointed me towards Stephen Beck, a great great grandson of Michael's, who had done considerable research on their family tree and we swapped information. He confirmed that Brother Patrick is a son of John, and that John was the oldest brother of Martin and Catherine McKenzie. Catherine was Michael's youngest daughter and married William Neary.

Bob Dix found Michael McKenzie's property records at the Valuation Office in Dublin on our May 2001 trip. He is shown as leaseholder of parcel #5 in Carrownlabaun (Carralavin) about 1861. We could not tell if this was an occasion in which many records were brought up to date or the date of an actual transfer of lease. In the early 1880's, Michael McKenzie is still shown as leaseholder and in an entry dated 1901, the same property passes to William Neary. In an entry dated 1928, John Malley of the Irish Land Commission is the listed leaseholder and then "Catherine Neary (Wm)". I take it that this means Catherine is William's widow, however other entries throughout the records, specified "widow" so it is possible that William is still alive in 1928 though in a diminished capacity. The final transfer is entered in 1955 to James Neary. (In May 2002, I found a tombstone in Bonniclon Cemetery for William and Catherine Neary. William died in December of 1921 and Catherine died in October of 1944. No proof yet that this tombstone refers to the couple cited in the property records above.)

According to Stephen Beck, in 1934 Michael's grandson, Brother Patrick McKenzie (baptised James) went to Rome via Bonniclon. Along the way he visited his aunt, Catherine Neary, and took pictures of the family and the farmstead his father had been born on. Stephen Beck sent copies of the pictures to me and we took them to Ireland in May 2001 where Martin McAndrew immediately recognized the property. "Surely this is James Neary's place," he said to Peggy, his wife. Then they took us to that property where the house (now updated) and shed matched the photos exactly to confirm we were at the right place. James Neary had recently passed away and the house was now a rental cottage but I did not pursue the name of the present owner. The Valuation Office also contained plat maps and we could see that the Neary place is three quarters of a mile across the fields in a straight line from John "Red Jack" McKenzie's property at Knockroe. It is not difficult to picture Michael's son, Martin growing up with his first cousins, Patrick and Stephen McKenzie two farms away as the kid walks, that is across the fields. Martin is responsible for Pat and Stephen moving from Youngstown, Ohio to Chicago according to Mary Moran (see more under his entry in the tree).

Notes for ANNE (NANCY) DURKIN:

"Nancy" is a nickname for "Anne". (At Christmas, 2002 my grandmother, Mary Gorman Henry received a Christmas card from Anna Duggan. My grandmother confirmed this was the same woman, her niece, that I had always heard of as Nancy Gorman Duggan. Q.E.D.)

Notes for MARTIN MCKENZIE:

Martin is a key figure in the McKenzie history in Chicago. The first indication of his importance was Mary Moran's tale of Martin talking his cousins, Patrick and Stephen McKenzie, into leaving their steel worker jobs in Youngstown, Ohio and coming to Chicago to find work. I found Martin McKenzie's signature as a witness to Stephen McKenzie and Maria McLoughlin's marriage certificate issued in Chicago in 1897. Later, Margaret, James and Anthony followed their older brothers to Chicago from Ireland.

Stephen Beck of NYC provided the information that Martin had immigrated to Derby, Connecticut from which he "removed to Colorado in 1884" according to the Derby City Directory. Together we determined that Martin was a first cousin of Patrick and Stephen. He was born and raised in Carralavin (Carrowlabaun) less than a mile from their home at Knockroe. Stephen also provided Martin's birthdate which made him just a year or two younger than Patrick and Stephen. It is not hard to see them growing up together as friends and neighbors as well as cousins. And lastly Stephen Beck provided the information that Brother Patrick McKenzie (President of Manhattan College, NYC 1932-38) was the nephew and godson of Martin and came to Chicago in the late 1930's searching for but not finding him.

Mary Moran did not remember him very clearly which I initially took to mean he had passed away while she was still very young since her memory was so sharp on everyone else. So I had the Cook County clerk's office search for a death certificate for him from 1922 to 1937. None was found.

In September, 2001 I happened to talk to Jim Flatley (grandson of Patrick McKenzie) while distributing copies of the work done so far and he recognized the name from tales of his family. Jim said Martin was still alive during his very young childhood and while he had no memory of ever meeting Martin he was told that he attended Martin's funeral and had further information as well. He was told that Martin was in the Merchant Marine and only came to visit in Chicago once a year or so. He would promptly go on a bender and sleep it off in the attic. Eventually he was taken in by the Little Sisters of the Poor, died and was buried by them. The Little Sisters of the Poor do keep records, I discovered and Sister Ann offered to search as the records were chronological, not alphabetical. I checked with the funeral home, Barr, that handled and still handles the funerary arrangements for the Little Sisters and they also are recorded chronologically. (Barr's grandson, Tim called 11/9/01, no luck in his files). So I made a last attempt at finding his death certificate asking for the years around Jim Flatley's birth in 1942. I requested a search from 1938 through 1945. The "certificate not found" document claims they searched "1935 thru 1948".

Martin does not show up in the online death index maintained by the Illinois Dept of Public Health, currently complete to 1950. And Mary Moran adds the information that he stayed with the Little Sisters of the Poor facility located then on Prairie Avenue just south of 51st Street.

In 2008, Cook County began putting their BMD records online. There I found a "Martin McKenzie, died 9/21/1946 (Jimmy Flatley would have been 6 years old), file no. 26960." Got a copy of his death certificate, source of date, place and cause of death. His parents are listed as "Michael McKenzie" (sic) and "Annie Durkin", birthplaces unknown. His is listed as "Ireland." His occupation is listed as "fireman (stationary) and the informant is Sister Emilie (Home record). It is also the source of his burial date and place. Also the death certificate lists his birthdate as "November 9, 1862." Stephen Beck got Martin's birthdate from the public records office which was instituted in 1864. That date is more likely correct so I made no change there.

Notes for JOHN (RED JACK) MCKENZIE:

The North Mayo FHC located his death certificate stating that his death occurred December 29, 1896. The entry reports that he had pneumonia for a week before succumbing, and that he was attended by a doctor. His son Michael McKenzie of Rathreedaun is the informant. He is reported to be 78 years old at the time of his death. If so, then John was born in 1818. Previous date entered in the family tree was 1824, in Mary Moran's handwriting.

The death certificate of his son Patrick McKenzie states that John McKenzie was born in Mayo, Ireland.

The birth order of his children is documented from his son Stephen (born in 1864) onward. This leaves some question as to the birth order of the oldest four children. The oldest tree lists them in the following order: Bridget, Mary, Michael and Patrick. There are various birthdates available in the public record for them as well, but they vary from source to source with one notable exception. Mary McKenzie Igoe claims 1858 as a birth year in the

1901 and 1911 Irish censuses and that date is used on her death certificate. No other date has been found in the records I have seen so far. As you will see in their own pages of the family tree, I have assigned 1860 to Michael and 1862 to Patrick and we have the 1864 birth registration for Stephen. If Bridget was the oldest child then she must have been born before Mary, therefore before 1858. Mary Moran thought Michael was the oldest child but all the trees I have seen so far agree on the birth order I have used. (Of course there is the possibility they all started from the oldest tree and simply accepted that birth order.) Since writing the above, I found the 1911 Irish census entry for Bridget McKenzie Goldrick at Castlerock, Sligo in which she claims to be 54 years old which implies birth in 1857.

Accepting that their oldest child was born in 1857 meant I could set the marriage date for John and Bridget as "before 1857" with some fairly good degree of certainty. Their marriage record was not found but I do not know if only the Bonniclon/Kilgarvan register was checked and perhaps they married elsewhere. All we know about Bridget Ruane is that she was born in County Mayo (from her son Patrick's death certificate). The 1856 Griffith's Valuation lists John McKenzie at Knockroe but it does not list his marital status.

Notes for BRIDGET RUANE:

The Cook County, IL death certificate of her son Patrick McKenzie states that Bridget Ruane was born in Mayo, Ireland.

My Uncle Jim McKenzie confirmed verbally on March 21, 2000 that his grandmother had 16 children, but that included some who died very young. He mentioned that the family knew his father James and his Uncle Tony McKenzie had been born when she did not bring lunch to the fields where the rest of the family were working. She would have been 49 years old when the twins, James and Anthony were born. Her husband, Red Jack, would have been 60.

Our biggest mystery is this Ruane connection. The North Mayo FHC found nothing, though they could only look up to 1900 for her death certificate which we believe would be around 1908 or 1909. I could not find her in the Irish death index held by the Mormons at their Family History Center in Orland Park, IL. We have no leads to the names of her parents or siblings. Both the year of her birth and that of her death were added to the oldest tree by Mary Moran.

NB: Barbara died three days after her next older sister, Margaret McKenzie.

Hanna is the name written in the Kilgarven Parish Baptismal Registry. Honor or Nora was the name Mary Moran pulled out of her memory in summer 2000 when I asked for any other family names her fathers generation might have mentioned when they were talking about the family. Stephen Beck quoted a source on Irish first names that said Honora was the full name and had many diminutives including Hanna(h) and Nora. There was no mention of Hannah on any of the trees we received from relatives.

According to North Mayo "Hannah McKenzie, Rathredaun, a farmer's daughter, died on 9th of September, 1876, aged three months. She had suffered from 'Whooping Cough' for seven days and had not been attended

by a doctor. The informant to the registrar of her death was John McKenzie, Rathredaun."

Further, a footnote defines "Whooping Cough: an acute infectious disease, primarily affecting children, due to the infection of the mucous membranes lining the air passages by the bacterium *Bordella pertussis*."

The North Mayo FHC deduced that Hannah must be a twin of the Barbara McKenzie registered with the civil authority as being born the 6th of June, 1876. No reference to twins was found in the records. And no baptismal record was found for this Barbara. However, if Hannah was three months old when she died in September, then she must also have been born in June.

Notes for JOHN MCKENZIE:

I have his death certificate and it states his birthdate as June 12, 1861. And that he was 80 years, 4 months and 15 days old at his death on October 27, 1941. His parents are Michael McKenzie and Anne Durkin both born in Ireland.

But Stephen Beck's package of April, 2001 puts his birthdate as June 15, 1856 which is a more sensible date. It permits John to be 14 yrs older than Catherine, his youngest sister as the family history suggests. And it puts more time between his brothers and himself in terms of birthdays. Otherwise we have five births in four years assuming the birth order is correct. Possible but highly unlikely even considering the possibility of twins. I'll check with Stephen as to the source of the 1856 birthdate.

Stephen Beck had death certificates for the couple, John McKenzie and Ann. He also had a copy of the 1871 census of Ann's parents James Mullen and Sarah Coyne in Burnley, England which include a daughter, Honorah who he apparently believes is Ann. He says Honorah was written as Nora in the States.

I sent for the Derby CT death certificate and it is in the name of Annie McKenzie.

Her father, James Mullen, married a second time in 1862 two years after Ann was born.. The new wife's name was Honora. It is possible the name Anne was too much a reminder of the first wife and so it was changed in honor of the new wife (as it were). Anne herself was very close to a cousin, Barbara and perhaps was raised with Barbara in the house of her mother's sister. Barbara married a Kelly and emigrated to Derby, Connecticut. When John McKenzie immigrated to the US he settled first in Jersey City and then sent back money for his wife and their youngest daughter, Sarah, to join him. Shortly after their arrival, the family moved to Derby where the rest of the family was born. I note that Sarah was the name of Anne's mother.

Jack Marsden is their son. Mildred McKenzie Marsden died and her husband remarried to a Jean. Mildred was mentioned in Brother Patrick McKenzie's obituary in the New York Times as "Mrs. Frank Marsden of Island Park, NY" I was able to use the Long Island, NY telephone directories in the New York Public Library on 42nd and Fifth Avenue in Manhattan to trace the name of Frank Marsden from 1957 to 1994. Each time he moved, he stayed in Island Park and kept the same phone number. And on those occasions where the phone

number changed, the address remained the same. I then plugged the Marsden name into the internet white pages in 2001 and came up with a Jean Marsden with the same phone number in Island Park. I wrote a letter and she forwarded it to her stepson, Jack Marsden in NY.

Originally the year of her birth was listed as 1869. If true, she was 15 years old when her first child was born in 1884. The 1911 census data makes her 47 years old which infers a birth year of 1864 while the 1901 census shows her at 32 years old inferring a birth date of 1869. Her next older sibling Martin has a registered birthday of October 19, 1865 (bearing in mind that registered birthdates are least accurate of Irish records, tending to be later than the actual birth). If correct then Catherine could have been born late in 1866 at the earliest. In the 1911 census she claims a marriage of 28 years inferring 1883 as a marriage date. With a birth date in 1869, she was 14 years old in 1883. This seems unlikely. Being born in 1866 would make her 17 years old in 1883 and 18 years old at the birth of her firstborn. This appears more likely therefore I made a change in her birth date from 1869 to 1866.

Notes for WILLIAM NEARY:

William appears in the 1901 census claiming to be 46 years old (so 1855 for a birth year). He does not appear in the 1911 census at the Carralavin property suggesting he died between the two dates. His youngest son appears to have been born in 1909 suggesting William died 1909-1910. Of course it is possible William is living elsewhere in 1911. The property was not transferred to Catherine until 1920 according to the Valuation Office in Dublin.

In May, 2002 I found a gravestone in Bonniclon Cemetery with the names William and Catherine Neary entered upon it. "In loving memory of William Neary, Carralavin, Died 14th Dec, 1921 and his wife Catherine Neary, Died 11th Oct, 1944. R.I.P. Erected by their sons" But I'll wait for verification from their death certificates before entering this information on their family pages.

Notes for BRIDGET MCKENZIE:

Because their younger brother, Stephen, is the first birth to be officially recorded by the authorities in 1864, the birth dates of the first four children of John and Bridget McKenzie are based on a birth order which no one can confirm or prove. The second child, Mary McKenzie consistently claimed 1858 as a birth year in the censuses of 1901 and 1911 and it was also entered on her death certificate. Therefore the best guess for Bridget's birth year is "before 1858."

Her death certificate lists her as a farmer's widow, aged 79 years, who died of "senile decay." Her son, Thomas, also of Castlerock, is listed as informant. If she was 79 years old as of January 19, 1937, then she was born in 1857 unless her birthday occurred in the first nineteen days of January, 1858. "About 1857" is a reasonable assumption for her birth date.

At the Orland Park LDS May 13, 2003, I stumbled across their 1911 Irish census record at Castlerock in the parish of Kilmactigue, barony of Leyny, County Sligo. She is listed as 54 years old which makes 1857 fairly certain as the year of her birth. She has been married 31 years (therefore, since about 1880) and of her ten children, nine are still living. And we have all nine names.

On the 1901 Irish census I found in Salt Lake City archives in May 2004, she is listed as Bridget McKenzie where all the other eight residents are Goldricks including her husband Thomas Goldrick. She is listed as "married" and was born in County Mayo. At 40 yrs old she was born about 1861.

Stumbled onto their 1911 Irish census record at Castlerock in the barony of Leyny, parish (civil) of Kilmactigue at Orland LDS May 13, 2003. He is listed as 71 years old (i.e. born about 1840) and has been married 31 years, (i.e. about 1880). He must be the 74 year old in the previous paragraph. He could not read or write and made his mark on the census form.

I found all of her brothers and sisters in the baptismal records of Tourlestrane parish in Achonry diocese, County Sligo. But I found nothing for her. They were all born in Castlerock townland.

Per Mary Moran 6/27/00, Mary died during childbirth and the baby died too. I found her grave September 5, 2000 at Mt Olivet in Block 13 halfway from the west side road to the railroad tracks. Her tombstone reads, "Mary Durkin nee Goldrick beloved wife of Michael J. Durkin Born June 8, 1882 Died February 9, 1914"

Mary Moran says they had only been married a short time, less than a year so the marriage must have been in 1913. No marriage certificate was found in Cook County for this couple after searching 1912 to 1914 inclusive. In summer, 2003 I found the number of their marriage license in an index of Illinois marriages before 1917 at the LDS in Orland Park. Cook County found the license with the number. It was issued to Mary Golderick and that is why they claim they could not find it initially. The license gave me the location of the marriage at St James Church, 29th and Wabash in Chicago.

Mary's death certificate reports she had been in the US, in Illinois and in Chicago for the same length of time, namely 14 years. Therefore immigrated about 1900. As occupation she was "housewife" 1913 to 1914 and "housemaid" 1902 to 1913. Her birth date is entered as June 6, 1883. Her husband is the informant.

She is not listed at Castlerock in the 1901 Irish census. This tends to confirm her immigration before 1901.

I found the only Mary Goldrick in the 1910 census in Chicago, working as a servant to Emery H. Fahrney at 3319 Warren Avenue. He works in a Securities Office and she is a home nurse perhaps for the two young children also listed at that address. She is reported to be 23; our Mary should be 28 years old.

At Holy Sepulchre I found a Michael J. Durkin who died March 24, 1931 and is buried in Section 11, Block 1, Lot E-8, Grave 2. He is buried with Annie B. Durkin (second wife?) died December 23, 1952, a Betty J. Durkin died August 19, 1984, a Frank P. Durkin died February 28, 1992 and a Kevin Michael Nov 21, 1960 to July 5, 1993.

His death certificate lists Annie Durkin as his wife at the time of his death.

And I found his death notice while looking for one of the Daltons, "Michael J. Durkin, native of County Mayo, Ireland. late of 6623 S. Sangamon St. beloved husband of Annie Byrne Durkin, fond father of Thomas and Francis, brother of Patrick, John, Thomas, Mrs. M. Coggins, Mrs. M. Mullen, Agnes and Annie Durkin...interment Holy Sepulchre." Still no absolute proof that this is the same Michael J.

His birthdate comes from the marriage record at St James Church in Chicago. Actually it lists his date of baptism as the 10th of March, 1878 at the Church of the Immaculate Heart in Bonniconlon. His death certificate listed the 10th of March, 1881 as a birthdate.

Although dim to the point of illegibility, I believe I found her baptismal record at LDS Salt Lake City in May, 2004. She was baptised Bridget in May 1883 but none of the dates of the four baptisms in May were legible. Hers was the third one.

Death certificate spells her name as Bridgett and her mothers name as Bridgett McKenzie.

It also specifies she has been in Chicago for 49 years, arguing for 1903 or before as a date of immigration.

In the 1930 US census, a Bridget Goldrick is working as a maid at 59 E. Oak for a Dr Mary Hanks and two lodgers who work as teachers in a private school. Bridget has been in the country since 1904 and is a naturalized citizen.

Found her citizenship papers at NARA. She claimed a birthdate of March 25, 1884 and arrived in the US on May 27, 1903. She was naturalized on February 3, 1922 in the Superior Court of Cook County, IL. She lives at 61 E. Oak Street and her two residency affiants also live there: Mary E. Hanks and Gertrude Gane (sp? Gans?).

Mary Moran also reports that Bea played Irish music on the violin

Kate is listed in the 1901 census with her parents at Castlerock. She is twelve years old and attends school.

Mary Moran thinks they lived in or near NYC. And that they had no children.

But in the May, 2002 trip to Ireland, Peggy McAndrew thought Catherine died in childbirth at Castlerock and that Michael never remarried, probably buried at Kilmacteigue, or perhaps Aclare or Cloonacool. No tombstone found at Kilmacteigue nor at Aclare.

Her citizenship papers claim her birthdate was July 9, 1896 and she immigrated through Boston, Mass on September 2, 1923. She was naturalized on May 21, 1929. Annie and Beatrice McKenzie were her residency affiants.

She married JAMES IGEOE (Source: *Bob Dix FTW program.*) 1883 (Source: Irish 1911 census record.). He was born 1853 in Mayo, Ireland (Source: Irish 1901 census record.), and died Bef. August 1937.

Notes for MARY MCKENZIE:

Remarkably consistent, Mary claims 1858 as a birth year on both the 1901 (aged 43) and the 1911 (aged 53) Irish census forms. Her death certificate lists her as a farmer's widow, aged 79 years (1858 again) who died of old age and debility. Her son, Michael Igoe, of Knockroe is the informant. Estimated birthdates for her older sister, Bridget, and her younger two brothers, Michael and Patrick, are based on this consistency. Their younger brother, Stephen, is the first child we have a birth certificate for. On it, Stephen has a birthdate of March 29, 1864. Although these records are unreliable as was discussed in the introduction, we at least know that Stephen cannot have been born after that date.

This Knockroe farm is less than one half mile southwest of the Knockroe farm she was born on. Bob Dix found old tax records on this property also. The house has a green door and is set back from the road about one hundred yards. Her great grandson, Michael Igoe (b. 1967) and his family live there now. I spoke there at length with Michael's father, Michael (b. 1935) who lives at the Templetigan, Bonniconlon house where he was born. There have been eight generations of Igoes in the Templetigan house just a half mile east and south from Bonniconlon. You will find Michael (b. 1935) cited as the source for much of my Igoe information. His father is Tom Igoe who married Mary's daughter, Anne Igoe in February of 1927. He is named for Anne's brother, Michael Igoe, who is the informant listed above on Mary Igoe's death certificate.

Notes for PATRICK IGOE:

A laborer who worked for Uncle Tony McKenzie, Pat Igoe cut Mary Moran's hair along with her brothers and sisters and an occasional piece of ear. Uncle Stephen McKenzie said he was the smartest man who ever crossed over from Ireland to the States. Maureen Cogan reports her mother, Mary Mangan Smith, was of the same opinion. He had no formal education, but read voraciously and remembered all. He had a terrible drinking problem that killed him. Mary Igoe Burke suspects he is in All Saints Cemetery. I found him there in September 2001.

North Mayo reports Patrick was baptised January 4, 1885. His citizenship request papers all claim January 6, 1885 for a birth date. Remember his registered birth may be after his baptism if his parents did not have time to travel to Ballina within a week of his birth. In any event we can be sure he was born in the first week of January 1885.

The 1901 Irish census results show a James Igoe, 48 and his wife Mary, 43 and that they have 7 children 15 yrs old and younger. Therefore in March 1901 Patrick, their eldest child, is 15.

I found an entry in the Naturalization Index at the Chicago NARA office for Patrick. It gave a birthdate, date and place of arrival in the US, and the date, March 22, 1926, on which his application for citizenship was denied. The witnesses were James McManus of 613 Belden and John Goldrick of 7748 Prairie. He arrived in New York on June 13, 1909.

I obtained his naturalization papers 10/29/01 at NARA. They include a certificate to the effect that he immigrated on the S. S. Baltic out of Liverpool, England arriving New York City June 13, 1909. He filed a Declaration of Intention (good for seven years only) on July 9, 1917 which includes his physical description (5' 8", 170 lbs, ruddy complexion, red hair, blue eyes and no distinguishing marks). He lives at 520 W. 37th St in Chicago. And next he filed a petition for naturalization July 3, 1924 which included swearing to having resided in Illinois continuously since July 15, 1909. An affidavit signed by John Goldrick and James McManus that he had been known to them in Illinois continuously since July 1, 1919 is also included. The last page contains the Order of Court Denying Petition for "want of prosecution" dated March 22, 1926 along with a request for a continuance (granted) due to petitioner being ill dated November 23, 1925. It would appear Patrick simply dropped the request by letting it expire.

He is listed as a boarder at the house of John Keenan (his brother-in-law, married to Margaret Igoe) in the 1920 US Census. He claims to have papers filed for citizenship and to be a citizen of the US as of 1917.

His death certificate lists his birthdate as unknown and his age "about 55" (in fact he had just turned 54). All Saints had two Pat Igoes buried but only one whose age matched my information. The certificate lists his parents as James Igoe and Mary McKenzie of County Mayo, Ireland so I know we have the right one. His occupation is "Plasterer, in building trades". And his place of residence at death was 6600 Cottage Grove Avenue in Chicago.

Place of death was the Little Sisters of the Poor Residence, length of stay there was 10 years per her death certificate. All Saints Cemetery had her and gave me her death date. Perhaps her twin, Beatrice, died 10 years before? Mary is a citizen of the USA according to the death certificate, too.

Maybe I can look in the pre 1953 city phone books or get an address for her from her naturalization papers and then look for either until they stop. That should be a death date for Beatrice.

So I gave Bea the same birth date claimed by her twin sister, Mary, on Mary's death certificate. All Saints Cemetery has no record of a burial for Bea. Their actual birthdate should be 9 to 14 days before since Mayo North cites a baptismal record for November 20, 1889.

Notes for MICHAEL MCKENZIE:

Mary Moran thought Michael might have been the oldest child of John and Bridget McKenzie, but all the trees have agreed on a birth order and I'll stick with that until facts prove otherwise. He claims to be 38 years old in the 1901 Irish census which would give him a birth year of 1863. However, the North Mayo FHC points out that if the reported birth order is correct, then Michael's birth date must be before 1863 to accommodate his brother Patrick who in turn was born before March 29, 1864, the recorded birthdate of the next child, Stephen. In the 1911 Irish census, Michael claims to be 51 years old at his last birthday which suggests he was born in 1860 or about two years after his older sister Mary. "About 1860" is a very convenient birthdate and I settled upon it...give or take one year.

His death certificate lists him as a farmer, 67 years old (1863 again) who died of stomach cancer and asthma. His son-in-law, Joseph Henry of Carracastle, Bonniclon, is the informant. (This tells us that Joe Henry and Mary McKenzie married before June of 1930.)

Mary Moran says, and the Valuation Office tax documents in Dublin concur, that her Uncle Michael had the farmstead in Knockroe after his parents passed away. This was the traditional way of dealing with the situation. The oldest son gets the farm rather than subdivide among usually many offspring. The other children can marry into a situation, emigrate or join the church.

All of Michael's children were born there and after Michael died, his son John returned from America with his wife and took over the farm. John's two children were the last McKenzies to be born there, although in a newer house built by John on the same property. Both the old and new houses are vacant and in shambles. This was verified on the May, 2001 trip we took.

Michael's children include Margaret Horgan ("Peg" according to my Uncle Jim, "Maggie" according to the one page family tree which I know she made) and "Cousin Bea" of Washington DC (to distinguish her from my sister, Bea, who was in DC for school and met her there). My sister Peg remembers Annie McKenzie, oldest sister of Cousin Bea who was on the fifth floor of the same nursing home. Annie had become too confused to carry on a conversation, but would correct aides who misspelled her middle name, "Browne", like the color brown. Our grandpa, James Ruane McKenzie, also took his mother's maiden name as a middle name upon immigrating because it was American to have a middle name.

Notes for ELLEN BROWNE:

Ellen had a nephew that Mary Moran corresponded with, Michael Browne (married to an Isabella in Chicago) last known address is 1307 Drury Lane, Emporia Kansas. He is still in the white pages on the internet as of September 2000 at that address. He had a twin sister named Anne who lived in Harwood Heights, Chgo in the 1940's (Mary Moran cannot recall the married name). On a subsequent visit with Mary Moran, she recalled that Michael and Anne immigrated from Ireland to Chicago in June 1928 just before her mother, Aunt Annie, went to visit her mother in Ireland for the first time since emigrating. Are Michael and Anne the children of Ellen's brother John? John is found in the 1901 Irish census living with his mother, Anne Browne and his 3 yr old nephew, John McKenzie, Ellen's son according to North Mayo. There is evidence to suggest John Browne is Ellen's twin brother, both born about 1866.

Found an entry in the online SSDI (Social Security Death Index) for a Michael Browne born July 28, 1908, SSN issued in Illinois who died November 12, 1997 in Emporia, Kansas in Lyon County.

Ellen claims to be born in 1869 for the 1901 Irish census. Her death certificate makes her 78 years old in 1944 (1866). She is a farmer's widow and died of old age and debility. Her daughter, Margaret McKenzie is informant. (Therefore Margaret has not yet married Bill Horgan.)

Ballina R.D. means Rural District as opposed to Ballina U.D. meaning Urban District. This is to distinguish between the town and the surrounding countryside.

Marriage Notes for MICHAEL MCKENZIE and ELLEN BROWNE:

According to the 1911 Irish Census, they had been married 14 years. Therefore married late 1896 or before April 1897.

On June 12, 2004, at Orland LDS, I searched 1896 through 1900 of the Irish civil marriage index and found no record of a marriage between Michael McKenzie and Ellen Browne. I searched many variations of their names.

Notes for ANNE MCKENZIE:

The North Mayo Family History Centre reports her baptism was registered on the 27th of February, 1898 while her civil registry of birth is for the 27th of April 1898, where she is reported to have been born at 530am. There was a fairly hefty fine if the civil registration was not made within seven days of the event and someone would have to go to Ballina on foot or by cart to make that registration. When they got around to it, the fine could be avoided by simply reporting the birth date as within the last seven days. Many Irish of the period find themselves baptized a month or so before they were "born". This would explain the two dates.

We have an alternate birthday (which would also apply to her twin brother John) of April 27, 1898. Mary Moran insists the 2-20-1898 birthdate is correct. She got it from Mary Edward Barnes who also lived in the DC area. The Gate of Heaven Cemetery reported her birth date as April 27, 1898. It would appear that Anne herself considered this her official birthdate. Apparently, whenever a birth certificate was required, the Irish government would supply the information from the civil register, namely April 27. Rather than correct that record, Anne might have accepted that date as close enough for legal purposes while continuing to observe February 20 as her actual birthday.

Mary Moran told me that Annie and Bea emigrated about 1925 or 1926 and stayed with Uncle Tony and Aunt Annie McKenzie who paid their way over. She also reported that Anne worked for the Delke family in Lake Forest in domestic service. And later for someone on Lake Shore Drive. May have worked for the Armour's in Lake Forest.

My sisters, Bea and Peg met her in the nursing home in Washington DC where her sister, Bea, resided. By then Anne had become too confused to carry on a conversation, but Peg reports she would correct aides who misspelled her middle name "Browne" like the color brown.

In an email dated March 20, 2003, Maureen Smith Cogan wrote, "The senile sister would be Annie McKenzie who lived in Chicago most of her life. Her last years in Chicago were spent in the service of the R. R. Donnelly [the publisher] family of Lake Forest. During the fifties, mom, dad and I [Pete Smith and Mary Mangan Smith] would drive up to the Lake Forest home and Ann would prepare a lovely dinner for us...I still have some vivid memories of what the house looked like...Mother always said she had a good heart. Right now I can see her so vividly in a navy blue coat and hat she often wore. When she left Chicago she went to Washington D.C. where she took care of former Secretary of State John Foster Dulles' wife. She often spoke of their son, the Rev. Avery Dullas, S.J. who frequently came to visit his mother and apparently was very kind

and grateful for Annie's care. He was made a cardinal about a year and a half ago."

Notes for PATRICK MCKENZIE:

Mary Moran knows he was 9 years old when he died, but nothing else.

Margaret Horgan writes he died about 1906 in her one page family tree (she'd have been 3 years old).

The Mayo North Family History Centre notes Patrick was registered as baptised on the 11th of February, 1900 but is not listed in the 1901 census (taken end of March, 1901) and surmises he must have died before then. His baptismal sponsors were "John McKenzie and Barbara McKenzie."

Without knowing any of the above, Maureen Cogan was sure he died as an infant.

Notes for BRIGID (BEATRICE) MCKENZIE:

Bea worked in Chicago for Mrs John Wentworth as ladies maid. She lived with Mrs. Wentworth in the Drake Hotel in beautiful quarters. Mary Moran would visit for Sunday breakfast while in high school. She got to take some clothes home and felt like a queen, pleated skirts!

Bea also worked for Mrs Valentine, of the Armour Family (meatpackers in Chgo). Then went to DC to look for work. Among others she worked for Mrs Forrestal in Washington, DC.

And we have an alternate birthdate, July 20, 1901. However the Gate of Heaven Cemetery records report July 23, 1901 so I'll go with that.

In the 1930 US census Beatrice McKenzie, servant, is listed living at 1406 Astor Street working for a Joseph Ryerson, who's occupation is listed as steel executive. She is one of seven maids and servants, has been in the country since 1920 and remains in alien status. She is 24 years old (1906).

I met her briefly at Bea and Russ' wedding in DC, 9/3/89. She sat in the last row with an assistant from the nursing home to keep her steps at a minimum.

She is still Margaret McKenzie (unmarried) on her mother's death certificate in September 1944.

Notes for PATRICK MCKENZIE:

Mary Moran thinks he was 83 years old when he died. This would place his birth date in 1856. Jim Flatley says his mom, Florence McKenzie Flatley, said he was 88 but she had heard disagreement on this. Florence is cited as the source of information on the death certificate which lists his birthday as June 1, 1865 and says he was 73 years old when he died. Patrick's marriage license agrees with 1865 as a birth year. It says he is 35 years old in October, 1900. The North Mayo FHC states that his birth most likely took place pre 1864 to accommodate his next younger brother, Stephen who is registered as being born March 29, 1864. Patrick's next older brother, Michael claims 1863 as a birth year in the 1901 census and 1860 as a birth year in the 1911 census. 1860 appears more accurate for Michael especially as Michael's next older sister, Mary Igoe, consistently claims 1858 as a birth year in both the 1901 and the 1911 Irish censuses (and on her death certificate). This allows Patrick to be born between 1861 and early 1863 inclusive. So I believe "1862 give or take a year" is the most precise birthdate possible. This then completes approximate birth dates for the first four otherwise undocumented births to John and Bridget McKenzie: Bridget about 1857, Mary 1858, Michael about 1860 and Patrick about 1862. Stephen's birth is registered for March 29, 1864.

The oldest family tree gave 1938 as Patrick's death year. But Mary Moran remembered that Florence Flatley did not want to come to Uncle Tony and Aunt Annie's 25th wedding anniversary in April, 1939 because she was still in mourning for her father who died three weeks earlier. His death certificate confirms 1939.

Pat worked as a laborer for his brother, Tony (Mary Moran's father) and worked in the steel mills before that. His death certificate says he was 40 years a laborer in the building trades and last performed this work in July 1938.

The 1900 US Census shows him living with his brother Stephen and his family at 3516 Parnell Avenue four months before his marriage to Anne. Patrick claims to have been born in August 1866. He claims to have immigrated to the US in 1886 and has lived there for 14 years. His occupation is illegible but after that in parentheses is (steel mill). This would make Patrick the first in his family to come to this country. Stephen immigrated to the US in 1888. (NB: the 1890 US census was destroyed by a fire and water damage in DC in the early 1920's.)

At the public library in East Chicago, Indiana, I found the following entry in the 1908 - 1909 City Directory for East Chicago, "McKinzie[sic] Patrick (Anna) emp[loyee of] Rep Steel Co h[oused at] 5016 Forsythe Ave" The librarian told me Forsythe is now called Indianapolis Blvd and 5016 would be in line with 150th Street in Illinois. At the Hammond, IN public library in November, 2002 I discovered this is about the only directory for the area for this time period. There was a 1909 Lake County Directory published by The Lake County Directory at 708 Broadway in Gary, IN. But no McKenzie's were listed in it (nor McKinzie, Kenzie, Kinzie). There was a 1900 Hammond, IN and West Hammond, IL (now Calumet City) Directory and vars others after 1911. The East Chicago librarian said the address was in St Mary's parish, East Chicago, IN. I found baptismal records for his children, James through Mary in the LDS microfilms from there.

In the 1910 US Census Patrick and Anne are back in Chicago living at 549 W 36th St with five children and two "boarders," Patrick and John Barrins. Pat McKenzie claims to be 40 (b. 1870), immigrated to the US in 1887 and is a naturalized citizen. Stephen McKenzie and his family live next door at 547 W. 36th St.

In the 1920 US Census, Patrick and Anna are at 3719 Parnell with seven children. And Glory Be to God, he is now 58 years old, born therefore in 1862.

In the 1930 US census, they are at 8316 S. Elizabeth with five daughters and a nephew, John P. (He is born in Ireland and therefore is the son of Michael and Ellen McKenzie.) Both he and Pat are plasterers in the building trade. Patrick claims to be 67 years old and therefore was born in late 1862 or early 1863.

Notes for ANNE FINLAN:

Aunt Anne and Uncle Pat lost four children; son James died in November, 1920 of a ruptured appendix. Oldest son, John died in July, 1922 in a car accident in Indiana. Ten year old Anne died January 1, 1923 of heart and lung problems (Mary Moran remembers being a pall bearer at age seven) and their youngest, Lorraine died of TB in October, 1935, 18 years old.

Anne had a brother, Michael, who came over to America with Mary Moran's uncle, Patrick Barnes (who came in 1908). Michael eventually returned to Ireland and raised a family there. He had a pub in Ballina called Fenlons per Mary Moran. It is now called Mary Murphy's and is located about halfway up Ardnaree Hill on the south side of the the road leading out of Ballina to Bonniconlon. Richard Tobin drew a map for me and an elderly patron on a bar stool inside confirmed the former name after the very young barmaid professed ignorance.

Mary Moran says the name on the tavern was spelled Fenlon. Jim Flatley says his grandmother spelled her name Finlan. According to her own death certificate, her fathers name was Lawrence Finland. Her name is spelled Finlan on her daughter Anne's death certificate and on her own marriage license issued in October 1900. And it is spelled Finlin on her son John's death certificate (found in Crown Point, IN).

Anne had a sister Kate (Catherine) O'Connell who owned a ranch with her husband near Leadville, Colorado. It was a very impoverished ranch according to Anne who visited it once and left in disgust after two days per Mary Moran. I did find a hay farmer, Richard O'Connell, 43, and his wife Katherine, 39, both born in Ireland, listed in Lake County, Colorado, "not in a city" in the 1920 census. They had five children: John, age 10, Patrick, age 7, William age 5, a daughter Unetta (sp?) age 4 yrs 3 mos and a son, Elmer age 2 and a half. Leadville is in Lake County, Colorado. Anne's death notice in 1954 mentions "sister of Michael Finlan and Margaret Finnerty of Ireland."

Mary Moran is the source for Anna's birthplace. Castleconnor is a townland on the east bank of the River Moy



about three miles north of Ballina. Presently in both counties, Sligo and Mayo, North Mayo FHC reports it was entirely in Sligo until 1898. It appears from their map to be the area's parish name as well.

Bob Dix found her in the 1900 US Census, Anne Finland is a servant for a MacDonald family 4 months before her marriage. She immigrated in 1896. Although her death certificate claims she was in Chicago for 55 years as of her death in 1954. If so, then 1899 may be the year of immigration if she came directly to Chicago.

I also have a copy of the marriage registry for St James Church at 2942 S. Wabash in Chicago. Patrick McKenzie and Anna Finlan were married on October 17, 1900. John Mullen and Marg't McKenzie were the witnesses.

Notes for JOHN JOSEPH MCKENZIE:

No birth certificate was found in East Chicago, IN but they were not required before 1916.

In February 2002, I found his baptismal record at LDS Orland Park in the Nativity Parish Baptismal Register. It confirms that he was born August 8, 1901 to Patrick "McKensey" and Anne "Fenlon". Sponsors were Stephen "McKinsey" and Mary "Fenlon". This does suggest John was born in Chicago before the family moved to East Chicago.

In the 1910 census, the family is back in Chicago and the birthplace for John is listed as Illinois while the next four children: James, Florence, Margaret and Mary have Indiana listed as birthplace.

The 1920 census lists Illinois as the birthplace for all eight children. John's occupation is listed as "clerk in the stockyards."

He died in a car accident in Crown Point Indiana in 1922. Kit Buechele was in the car. Gravinger from 37th and Parnell was the driver, might have been the owner. Skidded on a sandy road and "turned turtle" according to the death registry in Crown Point, IN.

The death registry at Crown Point, Indiana (Lake County Health Dept) had his death date entered as both birth and death dates implying he was 1 day old when he died. However it listed his exact age as "20 years, 11 months and 15 days". This gives August 8, 1901 as a birthday. His occupation was entered as "book keeper" and his mothers maiden name appeared to be "Finlin". All the information was entered by hand. His name was entered as "John J. McKenzie."

Notes for JAMES J. MCKENZIE:

No birth certificate was found in East Chicago, IN but they were not required before 1916.

I found his baptism in the LDS copy of the St Mary's Church, East Chicago, IN records. His birthdate was included. His sponsors were James McKenzie and Catherine Finlan.

We have his picture as a young boy with his oldest brother John (MM). Jim Flatley said his mother remarked that her brother died after a week in that hospital whenever they passed St George, though the death certificate clearly names St Bernards Hospital as the place of his death. The death certificate also names Nov 11, 1920 as his date of birth as well as his date of death. However it makes him 17 years, 11 months and 13 days old as of the 11th of November, 1920 which confirms the birth date. His mothers name is spelled Anna Finlan. And it

gives him the middle initial.

Buried in McKenzie - Flatley plot at Mt Olivet, no names are on the stone except those two.

I got a mass card from Maureen Cogan found in Mary Smith's collection after Mary died. Her name was H. Lorraine McKenzie. (I note that a niece was named Helen Loraine Nicholson, born one year later, Oct 3, 1936.) However, her death certificate is in the name Loraine McKenzie. Per Mary Moran, her nickname was Honey.

He married MARIA MCLAUGHLIN (Source: *Bob Dix FTW program.*) June 30, 1897 in Holy Angels Church, Chicago, IL (Source: Marriage license.), daughter of JOHN MCLAUGHLIN and CATHERINE TIMLIN. She was born March 15, 1873 in Carralavin, Bonniconlon, Co Mayo, Ireland (Source: Death certificate.), and died July 02, 1926 in Chicago, IL (Source: Death certificate.).

Notes for STEPHEN MCKENZIE:

From granddaughter Elaine McKenzie Fischer's letter of September 2000, "According to my baby book Stephen

McKenzie was born May 16, 1865...." My copy of the family tree printed out by Bob Dix in 1989 contains a note from my brother Steve that "Mormon records show Stephen was born 29 March 1864 in Mayo, Ballina District." The North Mayo FHC confirmed this finding in the Kilmoremy Civil Register of Births but reminds us this is the least accurate of birth records. It does give us a date Stephen cannot have been born after. Kilmoremy is the name of the civil parish that Ballina is in. His death certificate listed only 1865 for a birth date and that his age was "about 72".

In the 1900 Census, Stephen and Maria live at 3516 Parnell with two children, Mary (Aug 1898) and John (Sept 1899) and his brother, Patrick, four months before his marriage to Anne Finlan. Stephen's profession is listed as "fireman". In 1910, Stephen and family live at 547 W. 36th St next door to Patrick and his family. Stephen is now a "stationary engineer". He immigrated to the US in 1887 (1888 in the 1900) and is a naturalized citizen. In 1920 he is still at 547 W 36th St but now claims to have immigrated in 1890 and was naturalized in 1896.

The death certificate also says he was a retired engineer from Chicago Bridge and Iron Works after 35 years in the profession last performing his occupation in 1932. "Hospital records" is the source of the information on the death certificate. In 1937 Wesley Memorial Hospital was at 25th and Dearborn (now under the Stevenson Expressway) in Chicago per Mary Moran.

Notes for MARIA MCLAUGHLIN:

Her wedding license states Maria is 26 years old on June 30, 1897. If that is true, then she was born between July 1871 and June 1872. Her death certificate states she was born March 15, 1873. The 4th tree (from the Buecheles, I think) said she was born in 1869. This seems more likely and may be confirmed by the North Mayo FHC someday as civil registration begins in January 1864. On the 1900 census she lists March 1871 as a birth date. In 1910 she is 42 years old (b. 1868). Her age on the 1920 census form is too faded; could be 47 (b. 1873) or 57 years old (b. 1863).

From the September 2000 letter from Elaine McKenzie Fischer, granddaughter, "Stephen's wife Maria died June 30, 1926 of an embolism following an appendectomy." The death certificate cites "acute appendicitis, defected gallbladder, septic myocardial exhaustion" from June 26, 1926 to July 2, 1926 following an operation on her appendix and gallbladder, June 26, 1926. Mary Moran says it was the Eucharistic year (1926) and adds she remembers that the funeral was on the 5th of July because her mom (Annie Barrins McKenzie) and Aunt Bea McKenzie could not get black veils and dresses required for the services because all the shops were closed for the holiday. July 2, 1926 is date of death per headstone and death certificate. Mary Moran also had the story that Maria's wake and funeral had to be delayed until Uncle Stephen returned from a visit to Ireland by boat.

In the parish baptismal registry for Kilgarvan on page 30, the first entry is for twins, Bridget and Catherine born to John McLoughlin and Catherine Timlin of Carrolabin and baptised 26th July 1872. We have Maria's parents from her death certificate, John McLaughlin and Catherine Timeline. Catherine McLoughlin married Harry Jordan. Harry Jordan's two sisters, Bridget and Margaret married brothers, Luke and James Dalton who are uncles of my grandma Beatrice Loftus McKenzie. All these links are confirmed in numerous death notices we have been able to gather.

Mary is listed in the 1930 census as a stenographer in a Tea Store.

Worked for the A&P (Atlantic and Pacific) grocery chain in the head offices. Kit had a job there too, before she got married. Mary helped Kit with the children. Mary and Margaret had the apartment downstairs at 139 W. 74th St in Chicago. It was a two flat owned by their father Stephen.

Death certificate gives home address as 16718 Sentry Lane in Tinley Park, IL and birthdate of July 25, 1898.

Found her full name in the Nativity parish baptismal register. Her sponsors were John Durkin and Bridget McLaughlin. Bridget and Catherine McLaughlin were twins in the Kilgarvan parish baptismal register.

Notes for BEATRICE MCKENZIE:

Struck and killed by a truck in an alley near 36th and Wallace. Death certificate says "run over by wagon." Also that she was then buried at Mt Olivet. Apparently Beatrice was moved from Mt Olivet to Holy Sepulchre upon the burial of her mother in a family plot at Holy Sepulchre. Maria was buried there August 14, 1926.

In Kit Buechele's death notice her youngest sister was named Bernice. The tombstone names Beatrice. So does her death certificate.

And so does the Nativity parish baptismal register which further lists her birth date as July 12, 1907. The death certificate lists July 23. Informant was her father, Stephen McKenzie.

Artesian, Chicago, IL (Source: Death certificate.). She married JAMES MCMANUS (Source: *Bob Dix FTW program.*) May 10, 1905 in Holy Name Cathedral, 311 E. Superior St, Chicago, IL, son of PATRICK MCMANUS and MARY REILLY. He was born October 10, 1873 in Knockmore, County Cavan, Ireland (Source: Death certificate.), and died December 08, 1955 in Cook County Inst. Inf., Oak Forest, IL (Source: Death certificate.).

Notes for MARGARET MCKENZIE:

From the 1986 letter to Father Hayburn from William McKenzie Sr, "Dad's one sister in Chicago was Margaret. Her one child John McManus was a minor leaguer (semi-pro) pitcher in Chicago... Aunt Maggie's husband was a witty street car motorman, Uncle Jim McManus..." My father, William Sr above, spent weekends and summers with Aunt Maggie and Uncle Jim up on the north side near Devon and Western at 6344 N. Artesian. He said, later in life, he realized they were what his grandparents would have been to him, if they had not lived so far away in

Ireland.

Aunt Maggie's tombstone says 1873 for date of birth. My brother Steve found a Margaret in the Mormon records as "20 October 1865 in Mayo, Ballina District". But this turned out to be an older sister who died at age three years on July 25, 1868. North Mayo FHC found this second Margaret registered in the Kilmoremoy (Ballina) Civil Registry of Births. No baptismal record was found for her.

According to both the 1910 and 1920 US Census, she immigrated in 1898 and was naturalized in 1907.

Per Maureen Cogan, "Margaret worked as cook for the Chandler family on Asbury Avenue in Evanston. Her sister, Barbara, worked as nanny for the same family, before returning to Ireland."

Notes for JAMES MCMANUS:

In April 1910 he reports he is 36 years old and in January 1920 he is 46 according to the census data. The birthdate listed on his death certificate appeared to be correct until we obtained his baptismal record. Both the 1910 and 1920 Censuses report he immigrated to the US in 1900 and that he is a naturalized US citizen as of 1907. In both censuses, the family lived at 2219 Cleveland Avenue and his occupation is "streetcar conductor". In 1910, James' brother, John is living with them and they have a boarder, Michael Devine, another streetcar motorman who immigrated from Ireland in 1904.

According to his death certificate, the names of his parents are unknown. He last lived at 2145 W. Greenleaf in Chicago. From his death notice, "...brother of John and Andrew McManus, Elizabeth Clarke, and the late Kate Corrigan..." I found his grave at All Saints Cemetery in Des Plaines, IL but it did not have his name on the tombstone, only that of his wife, Margaret. The Cemetery assured me he and an infant were buried with Aunt Maggie. Susan McManus Byrnes wrote 10/22/01 that her dad, John McManus "had a brother that died quite young of diptheria."

I found a James McManus in the Ellis Island website arriving in New York on March 30, 1900 on the SS Germanic out of Liverpool March 21, 1900. He is a farmer's son, Irish, residing in Swanlinbar, declared \$15 in cash and is going to stay with his brother Andrew at the Fifth Avenue Hotel in NYC. He claims to be 18 years old and this is about ten years younger than the other dates I have seen. But Maureen Smith Cogan assures me this is him. She says she still has an Aunt Lena Smith Prior living in Swanlinbar, her father's sister, now (2003) 98 years old. But see last paragraph below for subsequent doubts about this record.

Maureen told me that her father Pete Smith was from Bonboy townland in County Cavan. (She thinks the parish name was Curlough.) And that James McManus was a neighbor. Mary Mangan stayed with James and Maggie McManus when she first came to this country and she met Pete when he came to visit James, his neighbor and friend from the old country. The County Cavan Genealogical Research Centre cited below gave us the following information, "The parishes of Templeport and Corlough were joined up until 1877 which is why Knockmore is in the parish of Templeport in Griffith's Valuation 1856-1857, and in the parish of Corlough after 1877...[Bawnboy and Ballynamadoo (where Mary Reilly came from) remained in Templeport parish after 1877.]"

In August 2003, the County Cavan Genealogical Research Centre gave us his baptismal record which gives us a birthdate, place and the names of his parents. His godparents were James McManus and Ellen Reilly. This casts doubt on the Ellis Island record cited above. His brother, Andrew McManus is only 13 years old in 1900 and is listed at home in Knockmore in both the 1901 and 1911 censuses. That cannot be him in the Fifth Avenue Hotel in New York City in 1900. However the James McManus who is godfather to our James McManus is more likely an uncle than his grandfather and so there may be an entire other family of McManuses from Swanlinbar who are first cousins to our James McManus. That would answer the objection to the James McManus in the Ellis Island record being ten years too young to be our man.

Marriage Notes for MARGARET MCKENZIE and JAMES MCMANUS:

The marriage license specifies an address for the priest, an F. M. O'Brien at 311 E. Superior. Newberry Library informed me that the street numbering system changed in 1909. The 1905 Chicago City Directory only gives "corner of N. State and Superior" as the address of Holy Name Cathedral but lists Francis M. O'Brien, Rev. as ass't pastor at Holy Name. I have doubts as to whether or not this is the correct license because it seems unlikely to me that our relatives would be married at the cathedral. And one of the US censuses gives a marriage date of 1907. On the other hand if Aunt Maggie was working in domestic service in the home of someone rich enough to have servants, that person could be living in the parish of the cathedral.

The witnesses in the parish marriage registry are a Patrick Fuhill (sp?) and a Katie Finlin. I know that Anne Finlan who married Patrick McKenzie in 1900, had a sister Kate. Mary Moran had already given me the story of her Aunt Anne visiting a sister, Kate O'Connell on a ranch near Leadville, Colorado. I cannot prove these are the same Kate Finlins but it is another hint.

He married MARY FEARON (Source: *Bob Dix FTW program.*) Unknown. She was born January 18, 1882 in Sunderland, County Durham, England (Source: Dec 2009 letter from Mary Cave.), and died March 25, 1961 in Hartlepool, Durham County, England (Source: Dec 2009 letter from Mary Cave.).

Notes for JOHN MCKENZIE:

Birth date is from the Kilgarvan baptismal record located by North Mayo FHC. They further note that, "no corresponding civil record could be located." We have a copy of his baptismal record from the Stephen Beck package. He was baptised on May 30, 1874. His sponsors were Michael Ruane and Bridget McKenzie. These were most likely his Uncle Michael Ruane and Aunt Bridget McKenzie Ruane (they married in 1848). John's oldest sister, Bridget McKenzie would have turned seventeen in 1874 and did not marry Tom Goldrick until about 1880 making her an unlikely candidate for godmother.

I received a letter from granddaughter Mary Cave on 17 December 2009 stating that her grandfather was not a plasterer (Andrew Killelea thought he was and our traditions have him teaching building trades to his brother Anthony McKenzie) but a coal merchant who also kept pigs.

More About JOHN MCKENZIE:

Notes for ANDREW JAMES KILLELEA:

Mary Cave sent a 2011 Christmas card and mentioned that Andrew had passed away. I found this obituary online.

"Major Andrew J. Killelea, (Ret), died on Sunday, December 4, 2011 in Sarasota county, Sarasota, FL. He was the son of the late Harold A. Killelea & Philomena Guy Killelea of Leominster, MA. He served in the Canadian & the British Army, & was a veteran of World War II. He worked for companies in England, South Africa, Rhodesia, Canada, and the USA. Intelligence Field: Military Intelligence & British MI-6 - (Foreign Intelligence - Field Officer/ South Africa). His siblings, Winifred Killelea Cabral, died April 21, 2003 & Alfred Killelea, died Aug. 21, 2003. Published in Sentinel & Enterprise on January 11, 2012."

I interviewed Andrew Killelea in Indianapolis November 5, 2005 on a visit to do family tree research there. We met at his office (he was 87 yrs old then) and discussed many things. He recounted his history starting from WWII. He was Canadian citizen and joined the RAF. He was a fighter pilot during the Battle of Britain and was shot down four times. He ditched into the English Channel and spent an anxious 30 minutes sitting on the wing of his slowly sinking aircraft. He could hear small boats zooming all around him but was afraid to call out. Some were British boats looking to rescue him but some were German boats looking to make sure he was dead. The English found him first. The final time he was shot down he was able to crash land in Richmond Green (west of London city centre) and staggered (all was blacked out, no lights anywhere) to the first pub he could find and drank until the police found him. He was removed from active flying against his will and given a desk job in the defence ministry. He hated it and reported to me that after a few weeks a man came to interview him for another position which the man could not describe, except to say it would all be top secret. Shortly afterward he found himself at Bletchley Park estate (comparable to Langley, MD) working on many projects including the decoding of the Enigma machine. Eventually he was sent undercover into Holland with a team of spies but would not say what for. He stayed in MI 6 (similar to the CIA here in the US) after the war ended and his wife was an actively participating agent as well!

It all came out when during our initial conversation, we got around to the lunacy of the American healthcare system and he mentioned that he had a company incorporated in Canada of which he was the only employee and he paid himself a salary and his Canadian taxes so that he would be covered by the Canadian National Healthcare system in case of need. And he pointed over his shoulder at a shelf containing a half dozen 3-ring binders each of them representing an import/export company. And instantly I recalled that James Bond had the exact same bookshelf in his offices somewhere in the novels and I blurted out, "Did you work for the CIA?" He looked at me and I could see several different answers run through his head. But what he said was, "I was invited to work for that firm at one time, but I could not admit that I was already at the table representing another interest." I do confess and do not deny that I thought he was perhaps exaggerating at the time, but his obit quoted above removes all doubt.

So in the aftermath of September 11th, 2001, he was contacted by the CIA and asked for any names of clan chieftans he had known in Pakistan and Afghanistan. He pointed out that they would all be dead by now and the contact said that's OK, it is a clan system and this and your name will give us access to their children running those clans today. Andrew gave them all he could remember and never heard whether it helped or not.

Notes for BARBARA MCKENZIE:

Barbara is believed by North Mayo to be a twin of Hanna McKenzie (baptised 7th of June, 1876) though no reference to this fact was found in the records. Barbara's birth is registered with civil authorities as June 6, 1876. No baptismal record was found for Barbara (perhaps baptised at birthplace - home?) and no civil record of birth was found for Hanna.

A Barbara McKenzie is listed as baptismal sponsor (godparent) to Patrick McKenzie, son of Michael and Ellen Browne McKenzie, baptised in Bonniconlon on February 11, 1900. If this is the same Barbara (about 24 years old) then she was married after that.

From Maureen Cogan in an email received January 27, 2003 upon receiving an initial Genealogy Report: "Barbara McKenzie immigrated to the U.S. in the late 1800s and worked as a nanny for the Chandler Book Store Family. Her sister Margaret McKenzie McManus was the cook for this same family. The Chandler House is on the national registry of homes in Evanston on Asbury Ave. For some unknown reason Barbara returned to Ireland sometime before the turn of the 20th century and then married Maurice Mangan. My mother, Mary Mangan Smith, said the reason she returned was because her health was not good in that the climate did not agree with her. ????"

Found a Barbara McKenzie on the Ellis Island website, "Ballina, Ireland as a place of residence. Arrived March 2, 1893 on the ship Teutonic out of Liverpool, England. Aged 22" That is born in 1871, more likely she was 17 yrs old.

His tombstone reads, "Pray for the souls of , Maurice Mangan, Beheymore, who died 12th Jan 1942, aged 80 years, and his wife Barbara, died 18th March 1951 aged 78 years, their son Maurice (Juney), died 20th Feb. 1986 aged 75 years, and his wife Ellen, died 1st Dec 1985, aged 71 years, R.I.P."

Maurice Mangan had a brother Michael, who had children Joseph, Maggie Ann (married Thomas Lockley), Mary Kate (Mr. White) and another girl. Joseph had children. And according to Richard Tobin there was another brother of Maurice who is the father of Father Patrick Mangan and Willie Mangan who died of leukemia, and their sister Penelope (Penny).

As far as Mary Moran knows all Maurice and Barbara Mangan's children were born in the townland of Beheymore, Ireland. In the 1901 Irish census for Behymore, I did find a family named "Mannion," comprised of Maurice Mannion, farmer, aged 37 (b. 1864), wife Barbara, aged 27 (b. 1874) and a two month old son named John. The census was taken as of end of March, 1901, so John was born in January 1901. Richard Tobin found enough problems to cast doubt on this family as being related to us. The townland is originally entered as "Behybeg" and then "beg" has been crossed out and replaced by "more." Barbara Mannion claims to have been born in County Sligo, while Maurice and John have been born in Mayo. However, it is the only census page I found for Behymore and it only has ten families listed, it is hard for me to believe this not the Mangans.

From Mayo North, "Barbara McKenzie, Stockane, a spinster, of full age, the daughter of John McKenzie, a farmer, married on the 8th of April, 1901, Maurice Mangan, Marlpit, a bachelor and farmer, of full age, the son of John Mangan, a farmer. The witnesses to the marriage were Patrick Conney and Bridget Goldrick. The couple were married in Bonniconlon Church, by E. Conington, Parish Priest"

I checked the Irish Marriage Index at LDS Orland on June 12, 2004 and it refers to a marriage in the third quarter of 1900 between Maurice Mangan and Barbara McKenzie in Ballina Civil district, volume 4, page 1. That would be a marriage date between July 1 and September 30, 1900. And this from the least accurate official record.

John's funeral mass card (from Mary Smiths collection via Maureen Cogan) reports, "John Mangan, Behymore, Ballina, Co. Mayo who died on the 28th May, 1979, Aged 78 years." So I have changed John and Pat's birth years pending more official verification to 1901 and 1902 respectively.

If I have the correct page from the 1901 Irish census for Behymore, then John was born in January, 1901. John Mannion is reported to be two months old as of 31 March, 1901 when the census was taken.

Notes for PATRICK MANGAN:

Per William McKenzie Sr, "Uncle Pat gave his car to my brother Jim when he had Jim drive him to Englewood train station in it. Uncle Pat was returning to Ireland. The car was a 1937 something or other."

Uncle Jim McKenzie and I (Bill, Jr) found the same type of car in a museum outside Vancouver, B.C. during the voyage of the three crabs in 1990. It was a 1928 Chevrolet and Uncle Jim told the story differently. He said Pat Mangan gave him the car in front of 7444 S. Lafayette, then took the street car to Englewood Station to catch an eastbound train because Uncle Jim had never driven a car. He learned how by driving the car to see Pat off at the station with his friend Ray Mahoney from across the street along as instructor.

"Uncle Pat" is actually a first cousin of Uncle Jim and my dad.

Mary Moran knew his birthday was the 12th of March because they used to celebrate their birthdays together when he lived with Aunt Annie and Uncle Tony and later when he lived with Paddy and Mary Moran.

Richard Tobin informed me that Pat returned to Ireland to take care of his mother, Barbara when his father, Maurice became seriously ill. Richard's own father, Jack Tobin died while Richard was very young and Pat Mangan treated him as a son.

For source of Pat's birth year, originally reported by Mary Moran to be 1901, see More About Notes for his elder brother John.

From notes I took in 2000 at the beginning of this work...Pat was a plasterer who returned to Ireland in 1932 because there was no work here. He had come to Uncle James and Aunt Bea's house every Saturday for ages, to take my Grandma Bea shopping.

He returned to the States in 1955 and lived with Paddy and Mary Moran until 1962 when he returned again to Ireland. He repaired the ceiling at 7415 S. Princeton which caved in before we moved out in November of 1961. For years I remembered Uncle Pat but did not realize who he was until I met his brother Frank Mangan in Newbury, England in May 2001. Pat was godfather to Joan Dix.

Notes for ANTHONY JOSEPH MCKENZIE:

He came to America in 1909 per his daughter Mary Moran. His cousins, the Mullins were in Philadelphia. Maybe 98 Godfrey St. A Delia Mullins used to visit Stephen and Patrick McKenzie in Chicago per Mary Moran. Occasionally visited Tony and Annie. Had a brother John west on Jackson Blvd that Uncle Tony visited. There was a nun in Philadelphia who was their sister. These may be related to Stephen McKenzie's wife Mary (or Barbara?) Mullins. Stephen McKenzie is Uncle Tony McKenzie's grandfather. (More found under the notes for Stephen's wife.)

I found the only Anthony McKenzie to arrive at Ellis Island in 1909 and he looks like a good match. Anthony McKenzie of Hartlepool, England arrived on June 12, 1909 on the SS Baltic out of Liverpool, England. A single, white, Irish male aged 29 years and three months. Tony stayed with his brother, John, in West Hartlepool before coming to America. His naturalization papers confirm the date June 13, 1909. He became a citizen of the United States on October 5, 1927.

According to his daughter, Mary Moran, Tony lived in Chicago at 5604 S. May St from April 1914 until Oct 1916 when they moved to 7338 Calumet, which he built. The family lived there from 1916 until 1953 or so. Then to 8051 S. Damen.

Notes for JAMES RUANE MCKENZIE:

From the North Mayo FHC Book, "a notation on the (Kilgarvan) baptism register states that James McKenzie married Bridget (Beatrice) Loftus on the 20th of October, 1909, at 'Ecclesia S-angelorum' Chicago." This is Latin for "Church of the Holy Angels." Stephen Beck had a copy of this very page which we now have.

Both the 1910 and 1920 Census indicate he immigrated in 1900 and was naturalized in 1905. Bob Dix found his arrival at the Ellis Island website. He arrived August 29, 1900 on the SS Oceanic out of Queenstown, Cork, Munster, Ireland. He was 21 years old, a clerk from "Balla", Ireland and had \$25 in his pocket. His ticket was all the way to his destination, his brother, Stephen, living at 3516 Parnell Avenue in Chicago.

He took the name Ruane as a middle name after he arrived here in the States because it was American to have a middle name. Ruane is his mothers maiden name.

In the 1910 census he is a clerk in a dry goods store. By 1920 he is an agent for a life insurance Co.

From an article in the "New World" newspaper dated Nov. 6, 1959..."St Carthage Parishioners Wed 50 Years...Mr McKenzie came to Chicago in 1900 and was employed in the white goods department at the Boston Store from 1900 until 1916. Later he was an agent for the Metropolitan Life Insurance Company from 1916 until his retirement in 1946."

The 1920 US Census indicates she immigrated here in 1906 and became a citizen in 1909.

At the Ellis Island immigration website, I found "Bridget Loftus of Carralabial (sic), a single female of 19 years arrived on April 5, 1906 on the Mariana from Queenstown, Cork, Ireland." Carralabial may be the transcription of Carralabin, an alternate spelling of Carralavin. (Both are alternate spellings of the Irish word Carrownlabaun, the townland just west of Bonniclon village.) She is going to stay with her uncle, H. Dalton, at 549 W. 41st St in Chicago. He paid her fare.

Family tradition holds that she changed her name from Bridget to Beatrice upon arrival in the US. "No Irish Need Apply" was still a concern.

These names were so familiar to me that I thought we were related. However Aunt Rosemary and Bob Dix both supplied the information that the Mulvihills were not at all related to us but were friends and neighbors of Aunt Catherine, Kit Buechele and her two sisters meeting most Saturday nights for great fun and talk. Uncle Jim McKenzie lived across the street from the Burkes before moving to Washtenaw. My own dad had mentioned Dan Mulvihill as another of the great Irish wits of his acquaintance. Marge Mulvihill was Aunt Catherine's best friend. This information included here in case the question of family connections should come up in the future.

Aunt Catherine was my godmother and was very good and generous to me. So the many funny stories I have about her but which are funny because so far out of character are not included in the tree.

Found her baptismal record in Holy Cross parish records at LDS Orland. Her full name and birthdate were confirmed. Her sponsors were Anthony McKenzie and Mary Dalton.

I found his baptismal record in Holy Cross parish in the LDS Orland records of the Catholic archdiocese of Chicago. His full name and birthdate were confirmed. His sponsors were John Taylin (?) and Bridget Goldrick.

Mt Olivet Cemetery records show that his remains were placed in a receiving vault at the cemetery on January 21, 1918 and buried March 16, 1918. He was 6 yrs, 2 months and 21 days old. He died in the 1918 influenza epidemic.

His death was a huge and lasting blow to his parents. Grandpa James insisted his wife go rest as she had been attending her sick little boy for quite some time. John died on his watch and grandpa never forgave himself the rest of his life. Grandma Bea would still go and cry after tucking her youngest into bed many years later, still grieving. Joan McKenzie Hurley told me this story.

I note John died at 6320 Champlain in January 1918 and his sister, Dorothy was born at 7444 S. Lafayette in September, 1918. The family apparently moved between the two events. Perhaps the association was too strong at 6320.

Her Uncle Patrick would have been 23 years old and immigrated to the States in 1886 so he is likely to have been her godfather. Her Aunt Barbara McKenzie would have been nine years old in 1885 and her grandmother Barbara likely died before 1861. Therefore this Barbara McKenzie must be a first cousin of her mother.

Lived at 6025 W. Fletcher (just south of Belmont) in Chicago, St Ferdinand's Parish and died in St Joseph's Hospital.

Her death certificate gives a birthday of April 25, 1888. Her tombstone only says 1885. She is mentioned in the 1901 Irish census as living with Michael and Ellen McKenzie at Knockroe and she is listed as 15 yrs old on that document. The baptismal record removes all doubt.

Found his grave at Holy Sepulchre. He is registered under "Goldrich" at the office but his wife Elizabeth was correctly entered. Her cousin is buried there also, an Andrew J. (Andy) Redmond, January 1, 1869 to May 9, 1932. They are in Section 9, Block 21, Lot 37.

On his death certificate, John's occupation is listed as conductor, Rapid Transit, Co. And that he was in the US Armed Forces in WWI. He is a citizen of the USA.

On June 24, 2003 I found him entering the US from Ireland as a naturalized citizen going home to 7338 S. Calumet in Chicago (Uncle Tony's house). He is a single male, 33 years old arriving at Ellis Island, NY on September 24, 1920 on the Celtic out of Queenstown, Ireland. Jack Goldrick confirmed it was his father returning from a visit to his mother in Ireland and his sister Bea had accompanied him. He was arrested upon arrival in Ireland on suspicion (by the British authorities) of being headed for the IRA. They released him after questioning. The ships manifest lists him as receiving citizenship on June 5, 1918 at Fort Crook (now Offutt AFB), District Court in Nebraska, ten miles south of Omaha. His son, Jack confirms he became a citizen while in the army stationed at Camp Funston, Kansas.

Their marriage license, issued August 12, 1930 lists his age as 24. This is consistent with a birthday in November or December in which case he would not yet have reached his 25th birthday in 1930.

Mary Moran remembers he had a brother who was a butcher (for Hi-Lo?) and who lived in St Bernards parish which was at 63rd and Stewart.

I met his nephew Richard Buechele (pron. Byoo-SHELL) at NARA February 28, 2002. We swapped info. He gave me George's baptismal certificate from St Anthony of Padua parish in Chicago. George was baptized George Ludovicum Buechele.

In the 1930 US census taken April 5th, George is living with his brother, Henry in a large apartment building at 1155 W 83rd St. He is a mail carrier for the US Post Office.
